Crossection is our Juried Show which runs from Tuesday, September 25 - Thursday October 25 at the Etobicoke Civic Centre. Pre-register by Thursday August 23. One piece, \$15.00, two pieces, \$25.00. Intake is Sunday, September 23, 9:30 - 10:30. The Reception is Sunday, September 30 from 2 - 4. Art pick up is Friday October 26 from 9:30 - 10:30.

Please remember to have your paintings ready to be hung. That means, use D-rings, and wire strong enough to hold your art.
Place the D-ring about one-third of the way down the frame so that your artwork will not gape but lay flat against the wall.
Volunteers are needed at take-in.





Mind your Business



Where Do I Begin? —by Cathy Groulx

When a person decides they would like to be an artist and do some painting, usually it is without any thought as to what they might like to be doing a few years down the road.

It can often mean a number of years spent trying out various mediums. Make a decision, learn the properties of that medium and then get to work. Spend the necessary hours and hours practicing till you feel you know the medium well and are producing consistently good work. Always use the best materials possible to make your work.

Now you might like to offer you work for sale. You need to be tough here. You may or may not get the positive response to your work that you were hoping for. Listen and learn.

Commercial art shows, studio tours and group shows of member's work within art organizations are a great place to put your work out to test the buying public.

Being accepted to have a booth at a commercial art show, where you are juried in and pay for the privilege, is a great way to set up a body of work and listen to the response of the people walking through the show. At these venues you pay for a booth but do not pay commissions on what is sold.

A certain consistency in what you are doing is expected by commercial venues. A Gallery or store wants work that sells. The exhibition experience you have is not usually relevant. Selling your work is what matters.

They will want to see samples of your work. If they like what they see, they may take a couple of pieces to try, and see if they sell. They want to be able to call you if they sell, and ask you to deliver more similar work to replace what sold.

If for example you have been painting a series of cats, and the buyers love and purchase those paintings, when you are called to bring in more work, do not deliver abstracts and expect this to work well!

At some point you need to decide whether this is where you want to be showing your work, painting commercially, or perhaps you may aspire to exhibit in galleries.

The roads you travel diverge at this point. In all cases you need to be producing the same quality of work.

Cathy has had 40 solo shows and participated in over 350 group shows. She has exhibited in Canada, the US, Denmark, France and curated and participated in a show in the Netherlands, representing Canada.


