Meet the Members

Christie Baker



Christie Baker is a contemporary artist residing in Toronto, Ontario, and a relatively new member of the COAA. Since joining the COAA in July, 2022, Christie was thrilled to participate in both the 'Visions' and 'Crossection' shows, where she met many COAA members. She is excited to take on the role of Membership Chair, and looking forward to working with several of these talented and dedicated artists. Christie is best-known for her landscapes. Her atmospheric paintings are free-flowing recollections of her experiences and emotions, inspired by memories of time and travel with family and friends. Working in oil and acrylic on canvas and wood, her work is deeply personal.

"I paint out of a sense of nostalgia, motivated by memories of meaningful places, people and times. Through my paintings, I explore my connection to people and my past."

Introduced to oil painting in her teens by a family friend, she began her self-taught art practice in earnest in 2017, after stepping-away from her role in Artist Management. A move to Toronto from Vancouver, where she lived for 20 years, provided impetus for change, and upon arriving in Ontario she completely immersed herself in the art community around her.

Christie works from her studio in the Annex, Toronto, ON. Her paintings and commissions can be found in private and public collections throughout Canada and the USA. Apart from her involvement in the COAA, she is an Active Member of the Federation of Canadian Artists (both the National and the Ontario Chapters), and a member of the Society of Canadian Artists, the Artist's Network, and Headwater Arts.

Christie continues to explore mediums and techniques through workshops at The McMichael Canadian Art Collection, Dundas Valley School of Art, MoMA, and the Federation of Canadian Artists. She completed an 8-week studio mentorship with prominent Canadian landscape artist, Maria Josenhas. She is currently completing a post-secondary certificate in Art and Design at OCAD University.

San Miguel de Allende by Rose Marie Nicolucci



I have known many artists and instructors who have been to San Miguel de Allende. There are two art institutions and many galleries located there. A wonderful place for artists, it is also a great place for writers and musicians. This authentic Spanish Colonial city, now a UNESCO Heritage destination has been on my bucket list for some years but the difficulty of getting there had always discouraged me. It is about 5 hours north of Mexico City in the mountains so getting there is almost like a pilgrimage.

I started with a flight to Dallas. Once in Dallas I had to change planes, catching a flight to Queretaro, Mexico. From there it was a one and a half hour shuttle ride to my destination - San Miguel de Allende.

With cobbled streets and small stone walkways it was a challenge to walk up the hills however, I stayed at a delightful boutique hotel Casa de la Noche (a converted brothel) that was very close to Centro Historical.

Several times I would take my watercolours and pads along with a lunch in my backpack to the main square by the San Francisco church

to enjoy the benches, hedges and trees. The key was always to find a good shady spot to do my sketches because the temperature would often rise to 28 or 29 degrees Celsius during the day. It was wonderful to sit in the bustling main square listening to the ringing of church bells and laughter of school children. There were also a number of American and Canadians there - many who have either moved there in their retirement or travelled to spend winters there. Definitely worth all the challenges to get there.

My sketch of the pavilion, with stars hanging from the ceiling, was lit up at night and my fellow travelers would dance to the Mariachi players there. The hibiscus was in a little garden outside my room at Casa de la Noche.

couldn't happen, but Saturday night's entertainment in the boathouse more than made up for that. We enjoyed the musical renditions of Cam Brown, a very talented young man. Many thanks to Anne Williamson for finding this location for us and looking after the mammoth job of registrations and liaison with the resort.

It was a happy group of artists who left the Sparrow Lake location on Sunday, having had a great experience and looking forward to returning next September.
