Julie Carlisle is a multi-disciplined artist who works in acrylic paint on canvas and mixed media. Julie studied Art at George Brown College in Toronto and Sheridan College of Applied Arts in Brampton, Ontario. Since graduating Julie has been employed as a Graphic Designer, Illustrator and Muralist. Julie has taught drawing classes, hosted an online sketching blog, and facilitated art workshops.

Julie finds inspiration in nature where her "plein air" paintings

come to life by using paint to draw directly on the canvas in layers. In addition, Julie also paints in a more systematic manner where designing the canvas meticulously produces highly decorative pieces inspired by the Art Nouveau period.

Julie's graphic design background motivated these crafts as the images are drawn in Adobe Illustrator and produced digitally. member, Karen Logan, recently assisted a good friend in closing her framing store after 17 years. She had a very large stock of new and used custom cut wood frames that she asked Karen to sell for her. Most of the frames were brought into the Women's Art Association of Hamilton office at the Cotton Factory. If you are interested in purchasing any they have been priced by linear size – length x width x \$0.08 for new frames and 0.04 for used. (eg. - a new wood frame

that measures 12" x 16" would cost \$16). These are custom cut frames so most are not standard sizes but Karen also has a VERY wide variety of acid free mats in all colours and a professional mat cutter so can custom cut mats to suit. Some frames come with glass but most do not but we can arrange to get glass cut if necessary. If you are interested in coming to see them please arrange a time to meet Karen at the Cotton Factory.
