

We have applied to a number of art galleries for shows in 2025 (The Assembly Hall in Etobicoke, Homer Watson House and Gallery in Waterloo, Ingersoll Creative Arts Centre, Glenhyrst Gallery in Brantford to name a few) without success. Galleries are now booking 2-3 years in advance.

After a successful career with Bell
Canada, retirement has brought new opportunities and time to pursue her passion to paint.





Working mostly in oils and acrylics, she finds inspiration in everyday life and beauty all around her. You will always find a painting on her easel in her home studio, but she can also be seen set up in the great outdoors, en plein air, capturing the colours, lights, and shadows, of rural life. An avid Bruce Trail hiker, many of her paintings depict the beauty and serenity of Mother Nature at work.

Nancy is an active member of the Central Ontario Art Association. Her work has shown and sold in local galleries, and has been juried into shows at the Homer Watson Gallery, Kitchener, the Minto Gallery, Harriston, the Art District Gallery, Waterloo, and Castle Kilbride, Baden. At the Assembly Hall Gallery, Etobicoke, her painting, "Just Chillin" was awarded first prize for best Oil/Acrylic in the show, Crossection. She has received a few honourable mention awards.

For the last six years, Nancy has been a participant and chair person in the New Hamburg Art Tour, working with a small group to ensure the ongoing success of what has become a major community event for the Township of Wilmot.








Book Review by Mary Flatt

The Age of Creativity: Art, Memory, My Father and Me by Emily Urquhart



In this book Emily Urquhart writes about her father, renowned Canadian artist Tony Urquhart in a very personal and sensitive biography while also exploring ideas about the "older" artist.

Going beyond the standard life history of Tony Urquhart as father, husband, artist, professor, she describes some of his interesting artistic processes. For example, he would pin up dozens of sketches and drawings on the wall so he could look at them daily and ponder what

he wanted to do with them – how he would solve the challenges they presented. Later, sometimes months or years later, he would take down a sketch and say he had an idea and from there would explore his next piece of art.

In describing her father's life as an artist, his exploration and thorough study of European artwork in the famous galleries and museums, Emily also walks us through much of the art developments of the 20th century. Additionally, she talks about the importance of creative work in our later years as she saw her father aging and continuing to practice his art daily with drawings, painting and large-scale sculptures. Many great artists were thought to produce their best works in the last decades of their lives. Witness the many fabulous late career works produced by Monet, Cezanne, Turner, and others.

How reassuring to many of us who came to visual arts later in our own lives and are still developing our skills and enjoying our artistic journeys!

For a pleasant read and some encouraging ideas about the "longevity of the creative spirit" pick up this very enjoyable book.

Emily Urquhart is the daughter of artist Tony Urquhart and writer Jane Urquhart, she did her undergraduate education at Queen's University, and worked as a freelance writer and book reviewer before completing her Ph.D. in folklore studies at Memorial University of Newfoundland.

Anthony Morse Urquhart, CM RCA LL.D. (April 9, 1934 – January 26, 2022) was a Canadian painter. He was recognized in the late 1950s and early 1960s as one of Canada's pioneering abstractionists, having been variously linked with the Toronto painters associated with The Isaacs Gallery and The Heart of London group that included Jack Chambers, Greg Curnoe and Murray Favro.

Since the 1960s Urquhart has followed an independent and autonomous path in his art, centered upon his distinctive 'box' format. In 1968, with Jack Chambers and Kim Ondaatje, he helped found Canadian_Artists'_Representation/Le Front des artistes Canadiens (CARFAC), the artists' 'union' that first established a fee schedule for public museum and gallery exhibitions of contemporary artists.

EXECUTIVE UPDATE - OPEN BOARD POSITIONS for 2025

- Vice President: Key duties include: providing backup for the President, assisting the executive team in finding show venues, assisting with Beyond the Palette in alternate years and assisting in planning and setting direction. The executive meets a minimum of three times a year and more often as needed. The Vice President typically becomes President after a two year term.
- <u>Treasurer:</u> Typically, the roles of Treasurer and Membership Chair are shared by one person, but they don't have to be. Key duties of the Treasurer include: preparing a monthly and annual bank account reconciliation, preparation of a financial report for the annual general meeting, disbursement of payments, receipt and depositing of dues from members and show entry fees. A good working knowledge of excel is required and a two year commitment is appreciated.
- <u>Newsletter Editor</u>: Key duties include creating four editions of the COAA newsletter per year and attend executive meetings.
